VACCINE CLINICS

Based on vaccine availability, the Hospital will provide H1N1 vaccines, on a first-come first-served basis, to members of the community who meet the established priority groups. Vaccines will be administered ONLY Monday through Friday, 8:00–10:00AM and 3:00–5:00PM.
